

# ENTERPRISING RESEARCHER PROGRAMME

**Delivery: 1-day interactive workshop with substantial online resources**

## **Why is this programme relevant, and why now?**

Careers take different shapes and the traditional view of a researcher's career is constantly being challenged through: opportunities to collaborate with new partners; the possibility of commercialising ideas; and extending careers outside academia. Innovation and enterprise skills are considered key attributes of the researcher, but often the researcher may not recognise them in themselves. Given how quickly the research environment and funding landscape is evolving, it is increasingly important that researchers are confident in the language of enterprise and their business and industry sponsors. This programme helps the researcher increase their awareness of these issues, and identify and build on these skills.

## **Who is it for and what does it cost?**

The programme is designed for all research students and staff. Participants are being funded by UHI to access the programme via the Universities Innovation Fund. The funding includes attendance at a 1-day intensive workshop and access to all online materials/support.

### Applications should be by email and include:

1. Preferred date/location of workshop you wish to attend from list below – however, each workshop requires a minimum of 8 attendees to run and where numbers are not achieved for a given workshop you will be added to the delegate list for the next nearest available location

3. Why you feel the programme will benefit your professional development and make an impact on your research and/or future practice
4. How you intend to share this learning with your colleagues; and
5. Confirmation of approval to attend from your line manager or programme leader.
