

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Many key ambitions for our students and wider economies incorporate entrepreneurship. ### What are the costs and how do I apply?

25 UHI partnership participants are being funded by UHI via the University Innovation Fund (funded by SFC). The funding covers 2 nights' accommodation along with all meals at the Newton Hotel in Nairn. An additional one night B&B is available for applicants who have a distance to travel. Academic partners will be required to cover all travel and any additional accommodation/food costs you incur.

Open to all UHI academic, research and support staff. **Applications should be by email and include:**

1. Your contact details with an outline of your current job role and areas of responsibility;
2. Why you feel the programme will benefit your professional development;
3. How you anticipate the programme will help make an impact on your role/teaching practice;
4. How you intend to share this learning with your colleagues; and
5. Confirmation of approval to attend from your Principal or department head.

Places will be allocated by **8 November 2019** with the overall aim of ensuring a good mix of academic disciplines; UHI geographic coverage; and entrepreneurial engagement. All applicants will be notified by email on whether a place has been awarded.
